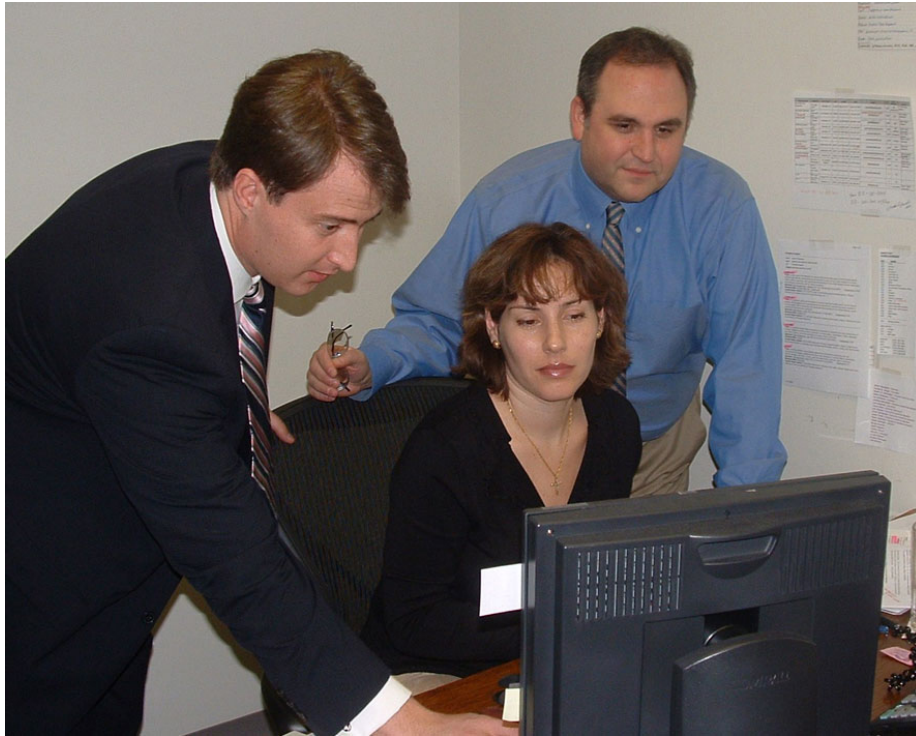
"Ms. Anlian is a beneficial addition to our team," said Development Director Andy Zovko. "Her skills and experiences in Armenia will help us better serve our members."
