Introduction

The *Financial Aid Directory for Students of Armenian Descent* is designed to provide students with information regarding financial assistance to pursue their education.

This updated fifth edition of the directory lists all organizations throughout the United States, including a limited number in Canada and in Europe, which grant various scholarships and/or loans. There may be more organizations and local community associations that award scholarships not listed in this directory.

The Armenian Assembly only compiles the information found in this directory and makes it available to the public. The Assembly does **not** provide the application forms for these scholarships nor does the Assembly provide the scholarships themselves.

It has always been one of the Armenian Assembly's commitments to promote education and encourage the younger generation in their studies. *The Financial Aid Directory* is produced to give interested persons a source of information about obtaining a scholarship as a student of Armenian descent.

Students should not overlook the many other sources of funding available. All universities and colleges have financial aid offices to service matriculating students. Additional information on funding sources in a state or community may be located through high school guidance offices, local civic associations, and public libraries. Information about government grants and loans is available from the offices of congressional representatives and state legislators.

Another opportunity offered to college students by the Armenian Assembly of America is the annual Summer Internship Program in Washington, DC. The program is described in the back of this publication.

Armenian Allied Arts Association Scholarship

Area(s) of study: Competition categories includes art, literature, drama, poetry, instrumental music, vocal music, and music composition.

Application qualifications: Age eligibility varies with the area of competition, but in general there are children, junior, and senior categories. At least one parent must be of Armenian descent. Participants do not have to be U.S. citizens.

Selection Criteria: Although scholarships are not granted, financial awards are offered through an annual arts competition. Awards are made based on merit of work.

Funds Available: \$50 - \$1,000, depending on age and area of competition. Funds are to be used to further study at an accredited school or with a recognized private instructor of the winner's choice.

Application Procedure: Applications are available by November. Write for further details.

Application Deadline: Prior to April.

Armenian-American Citizens' League Scholarship

Area(s) of study: General studies.

Application qualifications: Applicants must be permanent residents of the United States who have been living in California for at least two years and enrolled full-time in an accredited college or university. A minimum GPA of 3.0 (B average) is also required. Students from Armenia re eligible, but only if they meet the previously mentioned criteria.

Selection Criteria: Awards are granted on the basis of grades, need, and involvement in school and community activities.

Funds Available: \$500 - \$1,500. Scholarships are renewable.

Application Procedure: Write for further details.

Application Deadline: Dates change annually.

Armenian American Medical Association Scholarship

Area(s) of study: Medicine.

Application qualifications: Open to Armenian students enrolled in a U.S. medical school. Primarily intended for students residing and studying in a private New England medial school. Other should not apply.

Selection Criteria: Awards are granted on the basis of financial need, merit, and involvement in Armenian cultural affairs.

Funds Available: \$1500-2000 is awarded annually.

Number of Awards Offered: 2-3 per year.

Application Procedure: An official association application must be submitted. Mailed on request. Write for further details.

Application Deadline: September 5-October 15.

Armenian American Pharmacists' Association Scholarship

Area(s) of study: Pharmacology.

Application qualifications: Awarded to students of Armenian descent that are enrolled in the third, fourth, fifth, or sixth professional year at a college of pharmacy in New England (Massachusetts, Connecticut, Rhode Island), and pursuing a baccalaureate of pharmacy, doctor of pharmacy, or in a graduate degree program for pharmacy.

Selection Criteria: Based on academic excellence and/or financial need.

Funds Available: Amount of scholarship is determined by the Scholarship Committee, depending on the sums available in the Scholarship Fund.

Number of Awards Offered: One scholarship is given for one academic year.

Application Procedure: Write for further details.

Application Deadline: September 15.

Emmanuel Bible College Scholarship

Area(s) of study: General studies.

Application qualifications: Students are eligible for this scholarship if they decide to study in Emmanuel Bible College for at least three years. Applicants do not have to be U.S. citizens. The winner must pledge to work as a minister, evangelist, missionary, or youth director after graduation.

Selection Criteria: Good academic standing and character.

Application Procedure: Grants and scholarships are available to students enrolled at the college. Scholarships apply equally to full-time, part-time, and correspondence students. Selection is based upon the need and grades of students.

Area(s) of study: General studies.

Funds Available: \$250 - \$500. Renewable

Application qualifications: 3rd or 4th year dental student of Armenian descent completing their Doctoral of Dental Surgery degree at an accredited California Dental School.

Selection Criteria: Scholarship committee will base its decision on the applicant's academic achievement, personal statement, financial need and involvement in the Armenian community.

Funds available: \$1,000 (non-renewable).

Selection Criteria: Scholarship committee will base its decision on the applicant's academic achievement, personal statement, financial need and involvement in the Armenian community.

Funds available: One round-trip ticket to Armenia (room and board provided) to treat patients at selected dental clinics throughout Armenia.

Area of Study: Dental Hygiene (RDH).

Application qualifications: 2nd year dental hygiene student of Armenian descent completing their Registered Dental Hygiene degree at an accredited California Dental Hygiene Program.

Selection Criteria: Scholarship committee will base its decision on the applicant's academic achievement, personal statement, financial need and involvement in the Armenian community.

Funds available: \$500 (non-renewable).

Application procedure: Write letter of interest requesting application from ADSC.

Armenian General Athletic Union Alumni Scholarship

Area(s) of study: General studies.

Application qualifications: High school students who are entering college are eligible. Applicants do not have to be U.S. citizens but they must be permanent U.S. residents.

Selection Criteria: Awarded on the basis of merit and need.

Funds Available: \$1000 is awarded. Scholarship is non-renewable.

Application Procedure: Write for further details.

Application Deadline: May 15.

Armenian General Benevolent Union (AGBU) Loan Program in the U.S.

Area(s) of study: General studies.

Application qualifications: Full-time students of Armenian heritage pursuing Masters' degrees in communications, education administration, public administration, international relations or theology; PhD in Armenian studies (final two years only); first professional degree in law (JD) or medicine (MD) are eligible. Candidates must be students enrolled in highly competitive colleges and universities. Applicants must also have a GPA of 3.5 or better during their undergraduate study.

Funds Available: Loans range from \$2,500-7,500 yearly. Repayments begin within 12 months of completion of full-time study and extend 5 to 10 years depending on the amount of the loan.

Duration: One year.

Application Procedure: Write for further details.

Armenian Professional Society of the Bay Area Scholarship

Area(s) of study: General studies.

Application qualifications: Applicants must have full-time status at an accredited university or four-year college at the sophomore or higher level. The requirement is waived for teachers of Armenian subjects who are studying on a part-time basis to obtain a teaching credential or toward a degree in education or other related fields. Applicants must have maintained a GPA of 3.2 or higher and have substantial involvement in Armenian affairs. Students from Armenia are eligible.

Selection Criteria: Preference given to students interested in Armenian studies programs, elementary and secondary level teaching careers in Armenian schools and the arts (i.e. music, fine arts, literature, cinematography, and journalism).

Funds Available: \$1000-2000 and is not renewable.

Application Procedure: Write for further details.

Armenian Professional Society Scholarship

Area(s) of study: General studies.

Application qualifications: Applicants must be California residents who are full-time students of Armenian descent and who are enrolled at accredited colleges and universities. Applicants must maintain a minimum grade point average of 3.2.

Selection Criteria: Awards are granted on the basis of financial need and academic record.

Funds Available: \$1,000. Renewable.

Application Procedure: Applicants must interview. Write for further details.

Application Deadline: March.

Armenian Relief Society Eremian Scholarship

Area(s) of study: General studies.

Application qualifications: Applicants must be of Armenian descent and have already successfully completed the first year of an accredited college; must prove need based on financial situation; and express agreement to active involvement in the Armenian Community.

Selection Criteria: Awards are granted on the basis of financial need, academic merit, and involvement in the Armenian Community.

Funds Available: Varies. Depends on students' financial conditions.

Application Procedure: Applicants must submit three letters of recommendation, academic transcripts and tax returns. Write for further details.

Application Deadline: Applications will be available in January and should be returned no later than April 1. Interested students, based on country of residence, must apply to their regional ARS office, and not to the ARS Inc. Central Office.

Armenian Students Association of America, Inc. Grant

Area(s) of study: General studies.

Application qualifications: Grants are available to full-time students of Armenian descent at both the undergraduate and graduate levels. Applicants must have completed at least one year at an accredited four-year college or university in the United States.

Selection Criteria: Grants are awarded on the basis of financial need, high academic achievement, character, self-assistance, and extracurricular activities.

Funds Available: \$500-1500. Students may reapply each year.

Application Procedure: Write for further details.

Application Deadline: January 15th for requesting application (a \$15 application fee must also be submitted). March 14 for filing application.

Ayvazian Fund-Mt. Holyoke College

Area(s) of study: General studies.

Application qualifications: Applicants must be women of Armenian descent. Women from Armenia are eligible as well.

Funds Available: Varies annually.

Number of Awards Offered: Depends on number of applicants.

Application Procedure: When applying for admittance to the school, there will be a section on the application form where applicants will indicate they are of Armenian descent and wish to be considered for the Ayvazian Fund. A similar section is found on the Financial Aid application as well. Write for more details.

Application Deadline: Same as application deadline for admissions. Early Decision 1- November 15; Early Decision 2- January 1; Regular Decision- January 15.

Hagop Bogigian Scholarship Fund- Mt. Holyoke College

Area(s) of study: General studies.

Application qualifications: Students of Armenian descent who are enrolled in a four-year Bachelor of Arts degree program at Mt. Holyoke College are eligible. Applicants must maintain over a 3.0 GPA.

Selection Criteria: Awards are granted on the basis of academic achievement and financial need.

Funds Available: Amount depends on need. Scholarship is renewable.

Application Procedure: Students should apply directly to the financial aid office for financial aid and should indicate on the form that they are of Armenian descent.

Application Deadline: March 1 for September enrollment.

Constantinople Armenian Relief Society (CARS) Scholarship

Area(s) of study: General studies.

Application qualifications: Armenian students enrolled in an accredited college or university, starting with sophomore year are eligible. Students from Armenia are eligible as long as they are attending college in the United States.

Selection Criteria: Excellence in academic achievements, financial need, and involvement and interest in Armenian activities and affairs will be considered. Scholarships are granted to undergraduates only.

Funds Available: \$400-600 per award. Awards are renewable for 2 consecutive years only.

Number of Awards Offered: 10-20.

Application Procedure: Write for further details.

Application Deadline: Written request for application forms must be received before July 15. Students are required to complete and return the applications between July 15 and August 30.

Garikian University Scholarship Fund

Area(s) of study: Applicants must be pursuing a degree in one of the following areas: Armenian studies/literature, sociology, psychology, political science, Middle Eastern history, journalism, education (teaching or counseling), or music.

Application qualifications: Students who have successfully completed their first academic year at one of the Universities of the State of California are eligible.

Selection Criteria: Awards are granted on the basis of academic merit, financial need and community involvement.

Funds Available: \$750 - \$1,000.

Duration: One year.

Application Procedure: Write for further details.

Application Deadline: Applicants must apply to the Executive Board for application forms and return them completed no later than August 31.

Calouste Gulbenkian Foundation Scholarship

Area(s) of study: General studies.

Application qualifications: Applicants must be Armenian students who are sophomore or above and enrolled full-time in an accredited college or university.

Selection Criteria: Awards are granted on the basis of academic merit and financial need. Preference will be given to those candidates whose immediate family has not previously received a scholarship.

Funds Available: Amounts vary according to the country and the candidate's personal situation. A limited number of grants are also available for graduate students.

Duration: Renewable for up to three years of study.

Application Procedure: Write for further details.

Application Deadline: Requests for application forms and a copy of the regulations will be accepted between February 1 and April 15.

Remarks: No grants can be awarded for night courses, part-time, or non-academic studies. The Foundation does not encourage studies to be pursued at universities outside of the applicant's country of residence. No more than two members of the same family can benefit from the Foundation's scholarship simultaneously.

Hai Guin Scholarship Association

Area(s) of study: General studies.

Application qualifications: Students of Armenian descent residing and attending school in Massachusetts are eligible. Applicants must also have completed one full year of his/her freshman year.

Selection Criteria: Awards are based on scholastic achievement and financial need.

Funds Available: \$2,000

Winners must maintain a 2.75 GPA each semester.

Selection Criteria: Selection is based on financial need.

Funds Available: Full tuition is provided.

Area(s) of study: General studies.

Application qualifications: Full-time student enrolled at Georgian Court University's Women's College, preferably of Armenian descent.

Selection Criteria: Selection is based upon financial need.

Funds Available: Varies annually and scholarship is renewable each year based upon student's academic record.

National Association for Armenian Studies and Research, Inc. Fund Award

Area(s) of study: Research in the field of Armenian studies.

Application qualifications: Applicants must be graduate or postgraduate students of Armenian descent who are permanent residents or citizens of the United States. Research grants and fellowships are available only to those doing research in the field of Armenian studies.

Funds Available: There is no fixed amount awarded, but grants and fellowships may be renewable. Grants may be given for travel, cost of microfilms or other research materials, and for similar expenses. Stipends for living expenses are excluded. Only restricted grants as described are given.

Duration: For a period not exceeding one year.

Application Procedure: Each applicant must state in full detail the purpose and scope of his/her research. A detailed proposal, including a budget, details of any required travel, and the names of other sources that have been approached for funds; a curriculum vitae and recommendations from at least two persons of academic standing familiar with the applicant's previous work and proposed research must be submitted.

Application Deadline: Applications and inquiries must be submitted 3-6 months before grant request date.

Armenian Women's Educational Club Scholarship

Area(s) of study: General

Application Qualifications: Available for students who are US citizens or have a resident alien card, have Armenian Heritage, graduating from high school in the Greater Boston area, and are accepted to a four-year college or university.

Funds Available: \$1,000

Application deadline: April 30.

Area(s) of study: General studies.

Application qualifications: Applicants must be Armenian full-time students who have at least one parent who is "Hadjinti", and who are matriculated in accredited California colleges or universities, carrying 12 or more semester quarter units and engaged in courses of study with the objective of obtaining degrees.

Funds Available: \$500.

Duration: Annual.

Union of Marash Fund

Area(s) of study: General studies.

Application qualifications: Matriculated, full-time undergraduate or graduate students accepted at an accredited institution of higher education are eligible. Applicants must also be descendants of a Marashtsi (a part of Armenia/Asia Minor). Applicants do not have to be U.S. citizens.

Selection Criteria: Based on academic excellence, good moral character, financial need, and community involvement.

Funds Available: Award amount vary from \$500-1000 from several available memorial funds. Students may receive a maximum of four annual awards through re-application. Re-application is simply a letter of request updating prior information and having up-to-date transcripts sent if study has been continuous and at the same school. No more than one member of the same family may be awarded a scholarship in a given year although more than one family member may apply.

Application Deadline: All requested documents must be postmarked by July 31. Decision notification is by the end of the year. Application forms and informational material may be requested during the period January 1-June 30. Inclusion of a stamped, self-addressed envelope is helpful for a prompt reply to requests.

Harry and Angel Zerigian Scholarship-Bentley College

Area(s) of study: Accounting.

Application qualifications: Applicants must be full-time students enrolled at Bentley College. Must be day-division sophomores majoring in accounting who have satisfactorily completed all course work through the fall of sophomore year.

Selection Criteria: Awards are granted on the basis of financial need and academic achievement. Preference given to students from Haverhill, Lawrence, Waltham or Watertown Massachusetts high schools.

Funds Available: Award amount varies and is based on student needs and the number of students who are eligible for the scholarship.

Application Procedure: Students cannot apply directly for this scholarship. When a student applies for financial aid, the college's financial aid office will apply the Zerigian scholarship to their total aid package.
